- Early access and first consideration for post-Florence figurative works



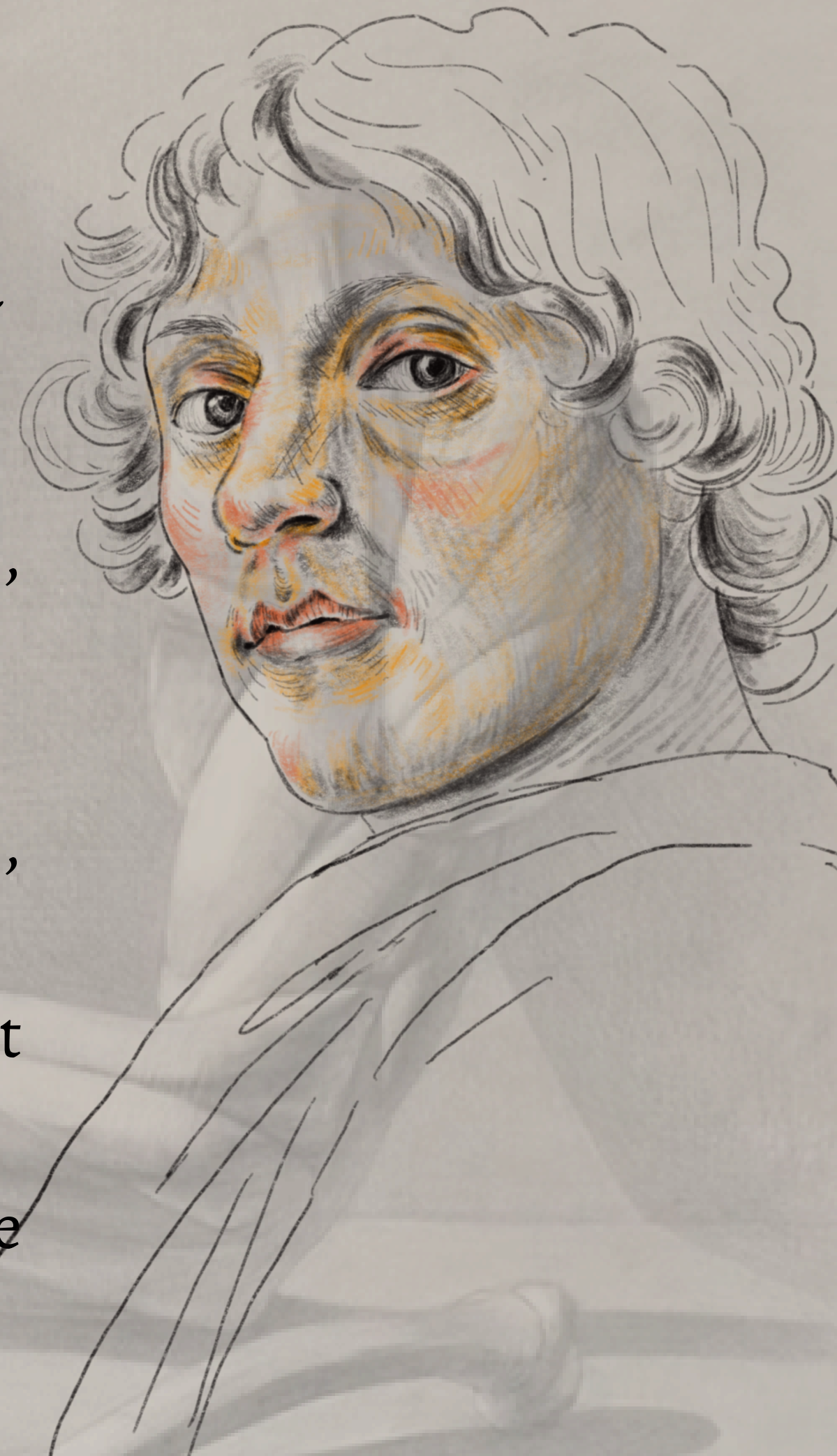

Patrons receive:

- An 18x24" original painting completed after my return, informed by the Florence studies
- Two to three original preparatory sketches
- A bound studio booklet, documenting process notes, anatomical observations, and visual research
- A handwritten studio letter reflecting on significant breakthroughs, failures, and shifts
- Early access and first consideration for post-Florence figurative works
